Dear Residents, Family Members and Resident Representatives,

We have learned that two staff members have tested positive for COVID-19. One person works in our Assisted Living neighborhood, and the other person oversees all three neighborhoods. Based on this, we will be COVID-testing all of our residents today. We have also learned that an Essential Caregiver has tested positive for COVID-19. This person has not performed any Essential Caregiver services at Sunnyside Manor, but was on site to receive the COVID-19 vaccine.

Unfortunately, these test results further delay our resumption of services in Assisted Living and Recollections because two or more COVID-positive staff members require that we remain in outbreak status. This also means that Essential Caregiver visits in Assisted Living and Recollections must be suspended. The schedule for Skilled Nursing has not changed. Please see the revised schedules below.

We'd like to remind you that the New Jersey Department of Health requires that our Essential Caregiver visits are conducted as safely as possible, and that Essential Caregivers follow infection control practices, handwashing and proper use of PPE. Any Essential Caregiver who does not follow the rules communicated to them by Sunnyside Manor will lose privilege as an Essential Caregiver. We don't state this lightly, because we believe the revocation of privileges hurts the resident as much, if not more, than the Essential Caregiver.
